<b>Sanctification</b>	<p>Continual cleansing from the old nature (Romans 6:5-11)</p> <p>No longer a slave to our sinful nature</p>	<p>Continual enablement to live in accord with the new nature</p> <p>The same power that raised the Lord Jesus from the dead is ours to live our new life in Christ (Romans 6:4)</p>	<p>Continual freedom from Satan's influence</p> <p>Enablement to resist temptation (1 Corinthians 10:13)</p>	<p>Continual infilling and anointing of the Holy Spirit to live faithfully and obediently (Ephesians 5:18)</p>
<b>Daily Decision</b>	<p>Daily to affirm the truth of the sufficiency of Christ's death to deal with sin, sins, sinfulness</p> <p>Choose each moment to put off the old nature – dead to sin, alive to Christ. (Eph. 4:22)</p>	<p>Daily affirm the truth of the resurrection, that one has been raised to a new life in Christ.</p> <p>Yield one's body, mind and will to the Spirit as a servant of righteousness</p>	<p>Daily refuse to give opportunity for satanic deception or delusion (Ephesians 4:27)</p> <p>Daily maintaining our spiritual armor (Ephesians 6:10-20)</p>	<p>Daily affirm one's faith in the Spirit's ministry of infilling.</p> <p>Decide to walk in the Spirit, exhibiting the fruit of the Spirit moment-by-moment</p>

1. God designed the Christian life to work. We do not need to live in perpetual defeat and frustration.
2. God's provision and protection comes through appropriating what He has provided for us in the crucifixion, resurrection, ascension and Pentecost.
3. The Christian life is not passive. It is a life of persistent, daily affirmations and decisions
4. "The just shall live by faith" – Faith is a **decision** to **respond correctly** to God, which is manifested in three ways:
  - a. Submission to the Lordship of Christ in all things – making daily decisions to give up self-sovereignty
  - b. A pattern of obedience – bringing our decisions into alignment with His will for our lives
  - c. A pattern of trust – taking action based on what God says
